
25yd range under the red light



The Invasive Blue Catfish

The blue catfish was introduced into the James, York, & Rappahannock Rivers in the 1960s but are now prevalent in most Chesapeake tidal tributaries. They can live up to 20 years and are rapidly outcompeting the native catfishes. The Maryland State record for a blue catfish is 84 pounds! In 2018, the State of Maryland initiated a program to purchase MD harvested blue catfish to be served at State institutions providing food services. This program is aimed at reducing the invasive population while providing money to local commercial watermen.

Legislation

<u>HB1343 and SB 1000:</u> As reported previously, the 2019 General Assembly approved abolishing the Handgun Permit Review Board so that anyone who desired to appeal a State Police denial of a carry permit, or overly burdensome permit restrictions, would have to make their appeal to the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH). There, an Administrative Law Judge would hear the appeal. This would be a formal, court-like environment.

Recently, Governor Hogan vetoed the bill, so the civilian Handgun Review Board remains in existence, at least until the General Assembly reconvenes in January 2020. The Review Board ceased to operate in April because it did not have a sufficient number of members to conduct meetings. The Democrats in the General Assembly turned down a number of Hogan appointees earlier in the year. Currently, there are 520 appeals of State Police decisions pending.

The Governor stated the effort to abolish the Board is "...just another in a long series of politically motivated and ill conceived power grabs."

Governor Hogan has begun the process of appointing Board members under what are called "Recess Appointments." These appointees serve until the General Assembly either confirms or rejects them when the Assembly reconvenes in January.

As expected, the State Senator who sponsored the Bill, "Marylanders to Prevent Gun Violence," which is a Michael Bloomberg sponsored group, *The Baltimore Sun* and the President of the Senate, Mike Miller, **all condemned Hogan's action and promised to override his veto come January.** The Senator, who sponsored the Bill, made the comment "...when you have a civilian Board overriding the State Police who follow the law, I don't think the legislature can allow that to continue"

The Baltimore Sun, in an editorial, stated the intent of abolishing the Board "...was to close a loophole that the pro-gun community has been exploiting during the Hogan years to put more weapons in people's hands" The editorial went on to say that as a result of Hogan's veto "...hundreds of more guns are likely to be put on the streets which, in turn, will likely mean more 'diversions' of guns from the law-abiding to the criminal."

Stay tuned come January!

Club Shoots

.22 Rimfire Rifle Shoot

Our annual Club .22 Rimfire Rifle Shoot will be held on **June 16th** from 10a to 2p. The match is open to all club members in good standing and their immediate family members per our bylaws.

Any .22 caliber rimfire rifle (bolt, lever, semi-auto, etc) is permitted

Scopes and slings (per club rules) are allowed but no other shooting aids are permitted

The same gun must be used throughout the match

The match will be shot offhand/standing

Course of fire will be a total of 50 rounds, shot as follows:

25 yards- 20 rounds 50 yards- 10 rounds 75 yards- 10 rounds 100 yards- 10 rounds

Pistol Shoot

Our annual Club Pistol Shoot will be held on **July 14th** from 10a to 2p. The match is open to all club members in good standing and their immediate family members per our bylaws.

Any revolver or autoloader .22 caliber rim fire and/or center fire is eligible. All shots will be fired in the off-hand position with no secondary method of support.

Course of fire will be a total of 50 rounds, shot as follows:

15 shots at 25 yards 15 shots at 50 yards 10 shots at 25 yards 10 shots at 25 yards

Trap Shoot

Our annual Club Trap Shoot will be held on **August 4th** from 10a to 2p. The match is open to all club members in good standing and their immediate family members per our bylaws.

25 targets at 16 yards
25 targets at your determined handicap yardage
